Good Job "Certain but Wrong" Pastor Kris Beckert

Have you ever had someone try to explain why something bad has happened or given unsolicited advice on what to do about it?

- I. The Structure of the Book of Job:
 - Ch.1-2 Prologue: Sets the earthly and heavenly stages
 - Ch. 3-37 Back and forth heated debate between Job and his friends about why he is suffering
 - Ch. 38-42:6 God responds
 - Ch. 42:7-17 Epilogue: Job is restored

II. The First Conversation: "Why do we ?"

• Job's friend Eliphaz speaks

Job 4:1-6 Then Eliphaz the Temanite replied: ² "If someone ventures a word with you, will you be impatient? But who can keep from speaking? ³ Think how you have instructed many, how you have strengthened feeble hands. ⁴ Your words have supported those who stumbled; you have strengthened faltering knees. ⁵ But now trouble comes to you, and you are discouraged; it strikes you, and you are dismayed. ⁶ Should not your piety be your confidence and your blameless ways your hope?

Job 4:7-9 "Consider now: Who, being innocent, has ever perished? Where were the upright ever destroyed? ⁸ As I have observed, those who plow evil and those who sow trouble reap it. ⁹ At the breath of God they perish; at the blast of his anger they are no more.

Job 22:5-7 Is not your wickedness great? Are not your sins endless? ⁶ You demanded security from your relatives for no reason; you stripped people of their clothing, leaving them naked. ⁷ You gave no water to the weary and you withheld food from the hungry...

#2. Suffering _____

Job 5:6-7, 17 For hardship does not spring from the soil, nor does trouble sprout from the ground. ⁷ Yet man is born to trouble as surely as sparks fly upward... ¹⁷ "Blessed is the one whom God corrects; so do not despise the discipline of the Almighty.

Proverbs 3:11-12 My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline, and do not resent his rebuke, ¹² because the Lord disciplines those he loves, as a father the son he delights in.

#3. Suffering _____

Job 5:22-26 You will laugh at destruction and famine, and need not fear the wild animals. ²³ For you will have a covenant with the stones of the field, and the wild animals will be at peace with you. ²⁴ You will know that your tent is secure; you will take stock of your property and find nothing missing. ²⁵ You will know that your children will be many, and your descendants like the grass of the earth. ²⁶ You will come to the grave in full vigor, like sheaves gathered in season.

Romans 5:3-4 Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope.
